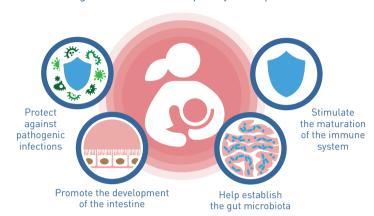

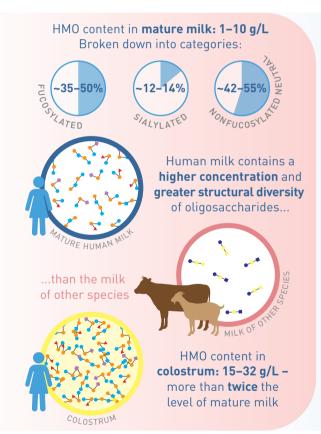
The immune system of the infant is functionally immature and naive

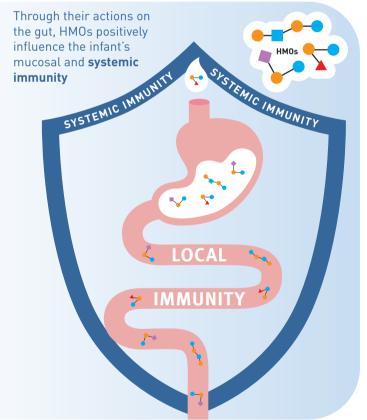
